

WHAT CAN I DO IF MY LOVED ONE WAS ARRESTED BY ICE?

- 1 Start your emergency plan and document all actions ICE agents took.**
- 2 To locate your loved one:**
 - Use the online locator at locator.ice.gov.
 - Find phone numbers for detention facilities at www.ice.gov/detention-facilities
- 3 To find court dates:**

Call the Immigration Court hotline at 800-898-7180 with your loved one's Alien Number (A#), an 8- or 9-digit number on all immigration documents.

Know your rights

You have constitutional rights:

- **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR** if an immigration agent is knocking on the door.
- **DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS** from an immigration agent if they try to talk to you. You have the right to remain silent.
- **DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING** without first speaking to a lawyer. You have the right to speak with a lawyer.
- If you are outside of your home, ask the agent if you are free to leave and if they say yes, leave calmly.
- **GIVE THIS CARD TO THE AGENT:** If you are inside of your home, show the card through the window or slide it under the door.

Basic Rights:

- Right to remain silent: **You don't have to answer any questions**
- Right to speak with a legal representative: **Do not sign anything without consulting a legal representative.**
- Right to see a warrant: **Always ask to see a warrant signed by a judge.**
- **Carry a Know Your Rights card-red card- with you at all times.**

Important Information:

- Only lawyers and accredited representatives can provide legal advice.
- Notaries ("notarios") are not authorized to give legal advice.
- **Secure immigration legal support:**
 - Locate an immigration attorney as soon as possible.

If ICE Comes to Your Home

- Do not open the door unless ICE presents a warrant signed by a judge.
- Do not answer any questions: You have the right to remain silent.
- Do not sign anything without consulting a legal representative.

If ICE Comes to Your Workplace

- Do not answer any questions or provide information about yourself.
- You have the right not to line up or follow unlawful orders.

During a Traffic Stop

- **Stay in the car** and keep your hands on the steering wheel.
- Drivers (if applicable) must provide their **licenses and registration**, but do not need to answer questions about their immigration status.
- In Massachusetts, **immigration status is not required** to obtain a driver's license.
- *Never present false documents.*

Prepare in advance:

- Gather important documents.
- Register your child's birth with your country's government and apply for a passport for them.
- Update emergency contact information at your child's school.



**NEVER PRESENT
FALSE DOCUMENTS**

Cut out the red card and keep it with you.



I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution. I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door.

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights. I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

These cards are available to citizens and noncitizens alike.
